On the first Sunday of each month we share in Holy Communion, and whether or not you are a member of the church you are welcome as a full participant.

SUNDAY WORSHIP SERVICES

Childcare for babies and toddlers (up to age 3) is available during worship in the nursery located in the Children's Center wing, or in our narthex, "pray-ground". (Note: We're currently looking for nurturing and committed adults to rotate into this ministry.)

We welcome children to EUMC with great delight! During the school year, **Sunday School** for three-year-olds to 6th graders is offered during worship in the chapel, directly following the Children's Sermon. For the kids who would prefer to stay in worship, activity bags are hanging in the narthex, ready for your use!

After service, share in cookies and coffee at **Coffee Hour** in the Wesley Room, located just to the right of the sanctuary.

Our various music ensembles and soloists from our **Music Ministry** enrich our worship.

Grow

Our **Adult Spiritual Formation** ministry offers ongoing and short-term groups, Bible/book studies, retreats, and special lectures.

We offer opportunities for **children and families** to deepen their faith through Sunday School, Youth Group, VBS, Community Groups, Family Camp, and intergenerational worship. **EUMC Youth** is more than just a youth group - it's a family that welcomes and embraces every young person who walks through the door. We meet during the school year on Sunday evenings from 6:00 to 8:00 pm.

Serve

Our **Children's Center** provides enriching and developmentally appropriate preschool and daycare for children ages 2.5 through 12.

Each week, **Edmonds Food Bank** assists over 600 families on Monday evenings and Tuesday mornings at Edmonds UMC with essential nutrition.

The **Thrift Shop** sells low-cost clothing and other items each Thursday, Friday, and Saturday from 10:00 am to 2:00 pm. Proceeds support mission projects locally and beyond.

The **Toy Shop**, provides a new book, stuffed animal, and toy for over 1,000 low-income local children during the Christmas season.

Join **Advocates for Justice** and engage in advocacy and public witness to address social justice issues that affect our community and world. Along with providing information and educational events, we connect members to service opportunities.

And everyone - even all of us - will hear of God's deeds of power.



Historically and today, cases of MMIW have been ignored by local law enforcement and left unsolved. We are proud of the progress that Washington state has made in solving many cases, and there is still work to do locally and nationally.
