PARENTING FROM A PROGRESSIVE FAITH PERSPECTIVE

What do you do when the parenting tools you learned from your church, or your parents no longer fit your religious and personal point of view? "God is watching everything you do," or "Satan will tempt you to sin." Then there is the conditional love point of view, "God loves you more when you are obedient and is disappointed when you sin." Or around homosexuality and other "sins", "God loves the sinner, but hates the sin."

What does it mean to parent with a different belief system around God and Jesus? What can you hold onto as solid ground and guidance? Diana and Katy will share their experiences of letting go of old conservative parenting tools and the struggle to replace them with new ways to parent.

She was excommunicated from the Mormon church for her same sex marriage. Diana has an adopted daughter, age 22, who is a miracle in so many ways.

Joseph E. Stiglitz: The Great Divide. Unequal Societies and What We Can Do About Them. New York, 2016 (Paperback)

Stiglitz, a Noble Prize winner in economics, has written extensively on the rising tide of inequality in America as well as around the globe. Based on a discussion of recent US economic history, including the tech bubble and the housing bubble with its subsequent financial collapse in 2008, the book highlights how specific policies greatly skew the distribution of wealth towards top earners and large corporations with potentially catastrophic consequences for our democratic system. At the same time, Stiglitz proposes changes that would temper the obsession with profit-taking and instead emphasize fairness and a more equitable society in general.
